



SOME SLUG AND SNAIL RESISTANT PLANTS

This list has been compiled from our own experience and from that of many of our customers. *It is not intended to be an exhaustive list and should be only treated as a guide*, since in some instances, slugs and snails will attack some of these plants if their favourite varieties are unavailable.

If well established, most woody perennials are not harmed by these pests but may suffer severe damage when young.
